This article highlights how mnemonic techniques such as acronyms, stories, rhymes, visual imagery, and associations create powerful retrieval cues. These strategies help learners organise information, improve recall, and reduce the difficulty of remembering large amounts of factual content. However, mnemonics are most effective when they support conceptual understanding and are combined with retrieval practice and regular review.

Try Tomorrow

- Introduce one mnemonic when teaching difficult factual content.
- Encourage students to create their own acronyms, stories, or visual associations.
- Combine mnemonics with retrieval practice and spaced review.
